Bird Walk Makes the Most of the Thaw

High waters did not curb enthusiasm or turn out for the club's annual Winter Bird Walk on February 22nd. More than 25 members and friends took full advantage of a sunny morning to search out a mix of winter waterfowl and song birds. Participants were unable to get to the Island as the ferry was closed so coffee was served early on a frosty ferry landing. Dave and Jane Winer treated the group to home-made biscotti and hot chocolate. A walk along the towpath and shoreline overlooking Ruppert's and Sycamore Islands produced good looks at many wintering and resident birds, some of which had not been seen on previous club walks. A pair of male Wood Ducks courting a female close to shore were particularly accommodating. Participants were also treated to good looks at our resident Bald Eagles. The Eagles appear to be tending eggs in an

We hope to encounter a variety of spring wildflowers such as Spring Beauty, Toothwort, Dutchman's Breeches, Trout Lily, Early Saxifrage, Bloodroot, Trillium, Golden Ragwort, Moss Phlox and Violets. Notes from the Island

Monday, February 3, 2014

Water Level at Little Falls: 3.5 Water Temperature: ice The ice in the main channel of the river is slowly melting away but our ferry crossing is still just thick ice. The river is predicted to go up about a foot in the next day so it will be interesting to see what happens next.

Tuesday, February 4, 2014

Water Level at Little Falls: 4.8 Water Temperature: 34 Almost all of the thick ice is gone. But the river is rising so the "Ferry Closed" sign will be up for a while longer.

Wednesday, February 5, 2014 Water Level at Little Falls: 5.4 Water Temperature: 34 THE FERRY IS CLOSED.

The river is rising faster than predicted and the ferry landing is quickly disappearing. The river is predicted to crest on Friday, so let's keep our fingers crossed that we can open the ferry by Saturday. The ferry has been closed for three out of the last four Saturdays because of ice, and thirteen days out of the month of January.

I learned that White's Ferry was closed today on account of a large ice flow coming down the river. I hope it breaks up at Great Falls before it gets here. I've already seen some barge-sized ice flows go by!

Friday, February 7, 2014

Water Level at Little Falls: 6.8 Water Temperature: 34 No Ferry today, no ferry tomorrow and probably no ferry on Sunday. It's just that time of year.

Living at an outpost. That's the rub to being a caretaker at Sycamore Island. The greatest challenge is the living day to day in the middle of a big, ever-changing river where the word "logistics" takes on a whole new meaning.

Monday, February 10, 2014

Water Level at Little Falls: 5.2 Water Temperature: 34 The ferry will be closed again today but it looks like tomorrow we'll be back in business. It will be nice to have the ferry back. I haven't used the ferry yet this month!

Monday, February 24, 2014

Water Level at Little Falls: 7.5 Water Temperature: 41 Well the river crested last night at just below eight feet. The river level is on a slow descent and the ferry will most likely be closed until Thursday afternoon.

The annual Sycamore Island Winter Bird Walk was yesterday and I think it was a very successful outing. I wasn't a part of it but there were quite a few species observed even though the Island was not accessible. Some of the more unusual sightings included Gadwall, Common Goldeneye, and White-winged Scoter. I have my doubts as to whether or an actual White-winged Scoter was seen since they are coastal birds.

Both Bald Eagles were seen near their nest so I think the eggs must have hatched already.

The snow is all gone and now it's mud season, at least until the mud freezes later this week. I hope the



river doesn't freeze again. It's supposed to be down in the twenties for the rest of the week.

Friday, February 28, 2014

Water Level at Little Falls: 5.3 Water Temperature: 37 The river will be too high to open the ferry until much later today but it looks like the ferry will be open and running all weekend. Lets hope that the river will stop freezing and flooding now that it's almost March.

Mary and I went hiking across the river at Turkey Run Park yesterday and we discovered the location of the old soapstone quarry that used to operate there. During the late 1800s and early 1900s the soft stone was harvested there and used as hearth stones or carved into sinks or tubs. The quarry was located at the top of the cliffs on the Virginia shore, just downstream from that large concrete pillar know as Leiter's guage. I had always wondered about that large treeless section of Turkey Run Park that is right next to the exit ramp for the CIA off the GW Parkway, but now I get it. We found the crumpled ruins of several brick and stone buildings, concrete foundations, steps, curbs, and the traces of an old paved road, maybe Leiter Road. We also found some soapstone in the eroded parts of the cliff.
