### **CARETAKER'S LOG**





Thursday -- November 2, 2017
Water Level at Little Falls: 4.4 Water Temperature: 54

The ferry is open again but the river is still really cloudy and brown.

I took advantage of the high water and I pulled the docks in as far as I could drag them. Might help come workfest day. I pulled the docks in the best I could using my bare hands but the real story is how Stan was able to use his grip hoist to pull the captain's float out of the river in one piece, all by himself! It took Stan a couple of day to have everything set up but once everything was in place he was able to hoist the dock up the bank one inch at a time until he had it safely up on high ground. Truly miraculous and it's going to make the workfest day so much easier. Thanks Stan!

# Notes for the November 8, 2017 Informal Meeting of the Sycamore Island Club

Richard Bertaut, Gerry Barton, Jeff Komarow, Ned Goddard, John Noble, Jim Drew, Sherry Fizdale, Joe Hage, and Ann Marie Cunningham gathered on the Island, but did not constitute a quorum. Therefore, no official business was conducted. However, we all enjoyed the warm cookies that Richard pulled from the oven immediately before he convened the meeting.

**Communications:** Gerry Barton reported that Vicky Judson will host the Annual Meeting/Holiday Party on December 13. The Annual Meeting is usually a short meeting where new officers are elected and the budget for the next year is passed. It is immediately followed by a pot luck Holiday Party where we all have a rare winter chance to mingle with our Island friends. Check the Islander for directions to her home. The meeting will commence at 7:15pm on Dec. 13.

Our webmaster, Tryon Wells, has had difficulty sending emails to all members lately, so apologies to those who did not know that the Good Timers lunch was canceled due to bad weather. Tryon is working with the web host to resolve the issue. It was suggested that he look into MailChimp, which can be used to send emails at no cost, although this may require double entering of member's email addresses into the club database plus the MailChimp system.

**Treasurer's Report:** Ned Goddard presented the projected budget outcome for 2017, with actual income and expenditures through September, and projected expenses through the end of the year. Sherry Fizdale's accounting of club income included a rebate from FEMA for flood insurance, and the results of a successful claim against an IRS penalty. Total income for the year was \$117, 312.

The bottom line looks good for the year, assuming there are no major expenditures before year end. Major accomplishments for this year include coming in under budget and the retirement of the construction debt. Variable costs, such as employee expenses, insurance, taxes, and utilities, and fixed costs, including capital improvements, repairs, entertainment, and grounds, all came in under budget, and it is expected that the reserve will build up a bit, bringing us closer to achieving the goal of having one year's budget in reserve.

Ned also presented the proposed budget for 2018. The good news is that he is not recommending an increase in dues, and that 2018 is a year where the new member lottery will be held so there will be additional income from new applicants. The budget responsibly addresses annual expenses, at a rate similar to last year. However, there is the concern that flood, health care, and casualty insurance costs will continue to rise faster than other expenses, perhaps more than usual, considering the hurricanes in 2017. The proposed budget is \$94,000, 2.06% higher than the 2017 budget of \$92,100. The estimated expenses for 2017 are \$84,269. The 2018 budget allows some flexibility to cover increased or unexpected expenses.

If you have any questions or comments on the budget, please send them to Ned Goddard at MSICTreasurer@yahoo.com. We hope to have questions and issues resolved prior to the Annual Meeting in order to pass the budget quickly and have more time for the Holiday Party.

**Caretaker's Report:** Joe Hage and Jim Drew reported on behalf of Stan Fowler that Stan had brought in the captain's float by himself, without taking it apart at all. Jim said that it took him two days of planning, but that once he began the job, it was done in just a couple of hours. Joe said that Stan used a come-along cabling system attached to a tree. Stan believes that he can reverse the process to return the float to the river in the spring.

Joe has been working on plans for the workfest scheduled for Sunday, November 12. There are no big projects planned for this year, just the usual cleaning of the clubhouse, raking, and

bringing in the other floats. Sherry Fizdale offered to buy paper goods for the potluck meal. Nominating Committee Report: John Noble presented a slate of officers for 2018. Most of the incumbents are willing to serve again. Jody and Bobby Benjamin have offered to replace Mary Ann Ross as Supervisor of the Clubhouse. Rodolfo Castro has found that he is unable to serve as Deputy Captain at this time. Please contact John Noble if your are interested in serving in this capacity. The election of officers will occur at the Annual Meeting.

**New Business:** John Noble presented the Club with a beautiful, large, framed photo of the Island as it was iced in during February 2015. Those of us who were present at the meeting were taken with the photo, and, especially, the idea of walking to the Island. A memorial service for Jane Winer will be held on November 18 at the Episcopal Church in Glen Echo. She will be greatly missed.

The next meeting is the Annual Meeting and Holiday Party which will be held at the home of Vicky Judson at 7:15 on Wednesday, December 13, 2017. Please come, and please bring something to share.

Also, please consider hosting the monthly meeting on January 10, February 14, or March 14. Please contact Richard Bertaut or John Noble if you are willing to host.

The meeting was adjourned so we could enjoy the remaining cookies.
